

GET TO KNOW DIALOGUE FOR PEACE PROGRAMME

The aim of dialogue is to gain mutual respect and mutual understanding, and to learn about each other's identities while appreciating differences.

The Dialogue for Peace (D4P) programme encourages scouts to acquire the knowledge, skills and competences they need in terms of Dialogue and peacebuilding, so that they can apply them in Scouting and in their everyday life. They can also develop a dialogue-related project to contribute to creating a culture of peace.

HOW TO BECOME A DIALOGUE AMBASSADOR



Badge

(for young people
from 11 to 21)

1. LEARN:

Experience dialogue by learning about the principles, knowledge and skills needed for dialogue

2. DO:

Participate in activities that develop your dialogue skills; or organise an activity or project that is related to what you have learned about dialogue and that is relevant to the local community.

3. RECEIVE

the badge from your Scout leader.

Certification

(for young adults and adults
from 18 and above)

1. Commit

Get in contact with your NSO to express your interest and get information on how to start your certification process..

2. Choose

Select your area of support, as a facilitator or a trainer of dialogue, and agree on actions for your personal development in the area. Online coaching and practice in the field are key in your development plan.

3. Get certified

Once you have accomplished all the activities agreed and your coach has validated your skills you will be certified.

Objectives of the programme

At the end of this learning process, a Scout of any age will be able to:

- Respect everyone regardless of their faith, race, ethnic background, gender or age; and is able to conduct a constructive dialogue with them
- Apply Dialogue as a tool for peacebuilding and mutual understanding.
- Incorporate the principles of dialogue as part of their own value system
- Promote all dimensions of dialogue (interreligious, intercultural, intergenerational, gender, etc.) among their peers and community

The D4P programme is part of the Better World Framework, an alignment of scout programmes that support young people to create a better world.
