


Fundamentals of Scouting



Unity does require that all members of a movement adhere to the fundamental elements which it has defined as being the basis for its existence. In the case of Scouting, these fundamental elements are the purpose, principles and method of the Movement.

What is the Scout Movement?

The Scout Movement is a voluntary non-political educational movement for young people open to all without distinction of gender, origin, race or creed, in accordance with the purpose, principles and method conceived by the Founder (Baden Powell).



The Scout Method

The Scout Method is a system of progressive self-education through the interaction of all the following elements:



The Scout Method is practiced by creating a meaningful educational experience for young people. It should be used in a way that is consistent with the Scout Movement's Purpose



Scouting is a movement of Young people supported by Adults

The Principles of Scouting

Duty to self

Responsibility for the development of oneself

Duty to God

Adherence to spiritual principles, loyalty to the religion that expresses them and acceptance of the duties resulting therefrom.

Duty to Others

Loyalty to one's country in harmony with the promotion of local, national and international peace, understanding and cooperation.

Participation in the development of society with recognition and respect for the dignity of humanity and for the integrity of the natural world
