



Next Strategy for Scouting review activity for NSO leadership, adult leaders and WOSM Volunteers

This session was designed to support any Adults in Scouting group including local adult leaders, National Teams, Regional or Global groups of volunteers to discuss about the future of the Scout Movement through Draft 1 of the next Strategy for Scouting. To better understand the reflections around the development of the first draft, we encourage to read the background document and to visit <https://strategy.scout.org/>. This will help to focus your discussion on elements that were not yet covered in the development of the draft. There is also a video clip available here that provides a quick introduction why we're developing a strategy at this moment in time, and how the current Draft 1 came to be.

Note that this session was developed based on questions we drafted, but feel free to adapt it to the reality and needs of the team, ensuring you still collect the requested answers. We encourage you to go through the feedback form before starting the session, so you get a sense of the kind of inputs we're looking for.

Share any thoughts and reflection with the Strategy Group based on the needs and reality of your NSO through the feedback form

20 minutes	<p>Reflection around the three impact statements</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. For each of the statement, request your team to rate the impact statement from 1 to 5 (1 being the lowest and 5 the strongest) on the following questions: "Do you feel the proposed impact statement speaks to your reality, is relevant, realistic yet sufficiently ambitious for"<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ The Scout Movement○ Your NSO* <p><i>*If you are part of world or regional structures, please consider this question for World Scouting at large</i></p> <p>For each rating, make sure you agree on an overall rating from the group.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">2. Once you completed the two ratings, reflect as a group on the following question: "How can this impact statement become more relevant for your NSO?" <p>Replicate the exercise for each of the three impact statements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ A world shaped by youth➤ A peaceful and inclusive world➤ An environmentally sustainable world <p><i>Make sure someone takes note so that you can fill in the feedback form after the session.</i></p> <p><i>If you feel you have no feedback on a particular impact statement, that's fine as well.</i></p>	Flipcharts or whiteboard Notes taker Draft 1 Strategy for Scouting

15 minutes	<p>Reflection on the 3 Strategic Priorities for the Scout Organisations</p> <p>Follow the same exercise as above (see "Reflection around the three impact statements") for each of the Strategic Priorities for Scout Organisations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">➤ A fit-for-purpose organisation➤ An adaptable organisation➤ An influential organisation <p><i>Make sure someone takes note so that you can fill in the feedback form after the session.</i></p> <p><i>If you feel you have no feedback on a particular strategic priority, that's fine as well.</i></p>	Flipcharts or whiteboard Notes taker Draft 1 Strategy for Scouting
10 minutes	<p>Final thoughts</p> <p>Once you completed the review of the draft of the next Strategy for Scouting, take a couple of minutes as a group to reflect on any additional comments or inputs regarding this draft for the Strategy Group.</p>	Note taker
5 minutes	<p>Closing</p> <p>The facilitator thanks the group for their participation and does a mini evaluation around the exercise (relevance, complexity, reflections for the NSO)</p>
