THE 16TH WORLD SCOUT MOOT, 2021

1. In November 2012, in accordance with the official procedure adopted by the World Scout Committee in 2007, WSB Circular No. 38/2012 called for invitations from NSOs to host the above-mentioned world events. The Circular indicated that the deadline for receiving declarations of intention was 28 February 2013.
2. The applicant NSOs were informed by the WSB as to the official WOSM guidelines and requirements for the hosting of these different world events as well as Resolutions regarding world events adopted by previous World Scout Conferences.
3. In September 2013, the WSC reviewed the invitations and the feasibility reports which had been received from the applicant NSOs. The WSB reported on the visits made by its staff to all applicants during the period May-September 2013.
4. The WSC has decided to bring before the Conference the following invitations:

- Located in central Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan

- Qafqaz Resort Hotel, Gabala <www.qafqazresorthotel.com>
- Near a city of 12,000 inhabitants
- 215km northwest of Baku

Proposed Facilities

World Scout Conference

- Plenary hall, exhibition areas, catering and internet connectivity. Additional break-out rooms available in nearby facilities. Hotels in close proximity.

World Scout Youth Forum

- The venue has a hall to accommodate plenary sessions, smaller meeting rooms, WIFI, catering facilities, areas for exhibition, offices and other facilities.

16TH WORLD SCOUT MOOT, 2021

HUNGARY – MAGYAR CSERKÉZSZÖVETSÉG (HUNGARIAN SCOUT ASSOCIATION)

Suggested Dates (subject to confirmation)

26th July – 5th August 2021



Proposed Venue

Main Camp: New Generation Centre (Új Nemzedék Központ) in Zánka

- Located on the shore of Lake Balaton
- 150 km from Budapest
- Two international airports 60 km from site
- Accommodates up to 20,000 people
- Accessible transportation, shower and restroom facilities, equipped with water sewage and electrical systems, along with medical services and disability access

Educational Objectives

- To enable participants to experience individual growth through teamwork and intercultural interactions
- To provide opportunities for participants to learn about their own responsibility towards democracy and world issues
- To challenge participants to be involved and take part in programmes that interest them

Proposed Programme

- Between days 2-5, 40-50 groups of scouts will be in mobile groups participating in the Social Responsibility Programmes. This takes place outside of Base Camp. Groups will discuss environmental problems and solutions about each group's given area.
- On day 6, groups will arrive on site. Programmes such as the beach, paint ball, the local market, jam session, board games, sports, international patrol meetings, and other activities will be available.
- The programme will feature international patrols. The patrols will choose 4-5 workshops through an online app. Workshops include global issues pertaining to social, economic, or environmental problems.
- Day 8 will be international and interreligious day. Participants will experience each country's culture, traditions, and religion.

Reducing and controlling costs

The Hungarian Scout Association is planning on receiving financial support from the Hungarian Government in 2021. 10 percent of the budget will come from individuals and outside firms. WOSM member countries that normally do not come to international events will be charged less than those that do, in order to accommodate financial issues.

Estimated Fees

- Participant fee: 550 USD (average)
- IST (International Service Team) and CMT (Contingent Management Team) fee: 440 USD (average)

Minimizing environmental impact

The Hungarian Scout Association plans to purchase local products in order to lower fuel costs. Biodegradable cleaning products will be allocated, and non-plastic utensils will be used.

16TH WORLD SCOUT MOOT, 2021

IRELAND – SCOUTING IRELAND

Proposed Dates (subject to confirmation)

22nd July – 1st August 2021

Proposed Venue

Main Camp: Larch Hill Campsite

- 12 km from the centre of Dublin
- Base for the National Training and Scout Centre of Scouting Ireland, along with Scouting Ireland’s National Office
- Area of the site is 35 ha, supposed to increase by 10 ha before the Moot happens
- Effective recycling and environmental management
- Has an IT network, electricity, accessible transportation, water, and regulated safety measures



Educational Objectives

- To encourage participants to experience other cultures and generate a positive response regarding diversity
- To provide opportunities for participants to grow as individuals and change their viewpoint through networking and dialogue
- To challenge participants to be involved and take part in things that interest them
- To ensure that participants understand what Scouting can do in relation to leadership and character

Proposed Programme

- Rovers will be asked to create their own “Moot Experience” during the registration stage.
- The first Gathering that happens at the beginning of the Moot will be for Rovers experiencing the full event.
- The second Gathering is a three-day event with GDV and the Dublin City Experience.
- The programme will have participants create their own experience each day through Scouting Ireland’s SPICES objectives (social, physical, intellectual, character, emotional, and spiritual).
- Cultural activities will be planned so that patrols can interact with local towns or villages in order to explore the country. Such events could include a service project or a cultural element.
- Social media technology will be available in order to create more connections between patrols.

Reducing and controlling costs

Scouting Ireland is looking to create agreements with suppliers of goods and services in order to lower costs for participants. A possible solidarity fund will be created in order to give financial support to many participants in different countries. 94 percent of the budget will come from NSO delegates. The rest will come from the government and corporate donations. Scouting Ireland has contacted their Department of Finance, Department of Tourism, Department of Education and Department of Children and Youth Affairs for possible financial support.

Estimated Fees

- Participant fee: 580 USD (average)
- IST (International Service Team) and CMT (Contingent Management Team) fee: 465 USD (average)

Minimizing environmental impact

The campsite has policies in place to minimize any negative impact on the environment. On site facilities would accommodate short-term issues while the Moot takes place.
