# 1. Agenda structure

In 2021, the World Scout Conference approved Conference Resolution 2021-06 on the evolution of the World Scout Youth Forum and World Scout Conference. The Conference adopted the proposal and principles for the 'new event' to achieve a more inclusive, diverse and engaging World Scout Conference. Innovative methods were to be used with a clear focus on youth participation in decision-making.

The agenda of the 43<sup>rd</sup> World Scout Conference will look different from previous years. It has been carefully curated to include crucial topics that will shape the future of Scouting. The Strategy for Scouting will provide a common thread through the agenda. Its content will help us choose topics for workshops and keynote speakers as well as impact decision-making sessions.

## Plenary

Plenary sessions are where all participants come together and where the decision-making happens. Participants will have a variety of different sessions to attend over the course of the Conference incorporating panels, presentations and reports, innovative delivery methods, engaging keynote speakers, ideas from both within and beyond the Scouting community, and of course voting. Plenary sessions are also a time for learning and coming together to celebrate our unity as a movement.

Plenary sessions will be spread over the full course of the Conference. Plenary sessions are no longer than 90 minutes to ensure variation and active participation.

All plenary sessions will allow digital participation, meaning that delegates who are not in the plenary hall can, in coordination with their delegation, contribute digitally to the discussions and decisions as deemed appropriate for the session. Most of the voting sessions will be scheduled for the afternoon (UTC+3), facilitating remote participation across time zones.

## Institutional breakouts

Institutional breakouts are sessions where the participants can learn more about proposals from the World Scout Committee and Member Organizations. There are opportunities to engage with the proposals and create dialogue between delegations on the various topics presented for decision-making at the Conference. Institutional breakouts will use a variety of working methods, ensuring accessibility and hands-on approaches to discussions. Some of these will be accessible to those attending online as well as in-person. This approach is designed to ensure that young participants and those new to WOSM's decision-making processes will fully benefit from the experience. The Strategy for Scouting, World Triennial Plan, WOSM Events Strategy and Draft Resolutions will all be available as mixed digital and physical sessions.

Participants will be able to meet the World Scout Committee candidates to ask questions and get to know the candidates up for election.

Opportunities will also be made available to spend time in Regional meetings, discussing and aligning on what the next Strategy for Scouting and triennial plans will mean for each Region and how each of us can contribute to achieving the Strategy for Scouting.

## Capacity strengthening workshops

A number of capacity strengthening workshops will be made available for Member Organizations to host sessions, showcase best practices, and offer sessions to participants related to topics linked to the Strategy for Scouting.

On day five, the NSO Workshop Market place will provide a space for participants to engage in a series of workshops showcasing best practices from NSOs, partners, and World Scouting. From mini panels to interactive workshops, these sessions will be packed with new ideas and inspiration for the Movement to benefit from. They will cover a range of important topics for the Scout Movement going

forward, such as sustainability, leadership, growth, and diversity. A variety of these workshops will all be available to online participants.

On the last day of the Conference, Member Organizations will have the opportunity to collaborate within their delegations to determine how they will implement the decisions made by the World Scout Conference within their own organisation.

### Exhibitions and networking

The Conference will have several exhibition and networking spaces that will feature activities, and interactive booths. These areas will be designed not only to showcase and learn about WOSM Services, but also to highlight our partners, events bidders, and other key stakeholders. By fostering connections and facilitating the sharing of ideas, participants will have the opportunity to engage in meaningful discussions and delve into key areas of Scouting, enriching our understanding of topics that define our Movement.

On day one, the Exploring the Conference Exhibition space will give participants the chance to discover the venue and key information for the next seven days. On day two and day seven Member Organizations will be able to explore the interactive WOSM Market which showcases all the achievements from the last triennium and where Member Organizations can access support and guidance about various areas across Scouting.

Participants will also be able to find out more about each other in the NSO Exhibition Area which will be available throughout the week and can visit the Hosts for upcoming World Scout Events and bidders for the future World Scout Events.

### Social activities and participants experience

During the Conference, participants can take part in a variety of sessions designed to enhance their experience, including by being in an international team. This includes The Game on day five, an exciting team game in a variety of locations in Cairo, and the daily dialogue time at the end of each day of the Conference. Having a daily space for international teams to come together and reflect in a cross-cultural and intergenerational way is an important part of sharing and learning from each other's collective experiences.

Other exciting Host events include the Opening Ceremony, the International Evening, the Egyptian night of cultural celebration and the Closing Ceremony.



